Objectives and activities.

This is the first Annual Report of the Melbourne Area Derby u3a, a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), created on April 1st 2025. It is the successor to the unregistered charity of the same name dissolved on March 31st 2025, receiving all assets.

Melbourne Area Derby u3a is affiliated to the Third Age Trust (TAT), uses its services and guidance and subscribes to its objectives.

The object of the CIO is the advancement of education and, in particular, the education of older people and those people who are not in full time work, by all means, including associated activities conducive to learning and personal development.

Our activities continue the focus of the old u3a in serving the people in Melbourne and the surrounding area, and working in collaboration with adjacent u3as.

As an organisation operated by its members for the benefit of its members our activities are demand driven. We offer self-managed and self-funded "Interest groups" as well as monthly member meetings offering talks and presentations and the opportunity for an exchange of information and social activities.

We communicate and interact with members collectively through our website and individually by regular personalised email and activity updates.

Governance and Management

Melbourne Area Derby u3a has a constitution as its governing document. This is based on model documents offered by TAT and the Charity Commission.

The constitution provides for the election of a Management Committee by members at the AGM. Only current members are eligible to vote at an AGM or serve as Trustees.

Trustee Recruitment and Appointment.

This year, being the first year, all members of the executive committee appointed to establish the CIO are required to stand down, offering the membership the opportunity to elect a new executive body.

In subsequent years one third of the elected committee are required to stand down on the basis of rotation according to length of service, forcing a churn of executive members and giving lay members a chance to elect new executives.

The constitution does not require election to specific offices. Officers are elected by the executive committee and roles appointed to make best use of experience and expertise.

Operational Management.

Whilst the monthly executive committee meetings remain the decision making body, operational work areas are identified as below. Some work is devolved to trustee led sub-

committees that report back with ideas and recommendations, other work to individual trustees.

Work Areas

- Officers: Strategy / Budgets / External interface
- Membership: All matters membership
- Events: Planning & Organising activities
- Groups: Facilitation of groups & leaders
- Media: External promotion
- Technology: Data management / tech support

Achievements & Performance.

Although this initial year has been one of consolidation, there has been measurable improvement in recruiting new members, promoting our services and offering a greater variety of events and group activities.

On-line membership application and renewal has been successfully implemented and a commercial integrated email and data storage platform is in the process of implementation.

Financial Review

Statement of charity's policy on reserves.

Melbourne Area Derby u3a aims to keep a level of reserves to cover 12 months of operating costs. The committee considers this a reasonable level for this type of charity. Social account activities are excluded from this figure as these activities are inflated by high-cost activities such as theatre visits and days out and are entirely self-financing.

Melbourne Area Derby u3a at the start of the financial year produces a budget based on known costs for the current year which is agreed by the committee. This amount is still retained within the overall bank account but shown separately on the Balance Sheet. This reserve is in line with the estimated subscription income and therefore funds should not be accumulated.

Finances

Annual operating income is almost entirely generated from subscriptions but during the year we have received compensation from NatWest Bank Plc and commission from a member taking a holiday through a nominated TAT travel agent.

The committee are looking at the accumulated cash reserves in excess of known requirements and have amended some of the subscription rates for 2026/2027. Some of the accumulation of money was generated by the old Melbourne Area Derby u3a and was a result of underspending during the years over the amount budgeted.

Social events are excluded from these figures as they are self financing to breakeven but any profit generated are included. During the year a Melbourne Area Derby u3a event was held which was open to non members and the gross revenue and costs are included in the figures.

Details of any deficit

Small deficits were incurred on the group activities at times but as these groups are self financing then the amount charged to the group members are adjusted to reverse the situation. There were two groups in deficit at the year end and both were due to timing differences with money reversing the deficit was received in the current financial year.

Future Plans

The primary emphasis of a member organisation has to be recruitment of new members and retention of existing members. The challenge has to be the encouragement of those members to take responsibility for governance and renewal.

Recruitment to the executive committee and group leaders is recognised as a potential threat to sustainability.

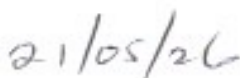

As local organisations seek to diversify their offerings, we have to respond by varying the services we provide to fit the demographic of our changing membership.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Scrutineer

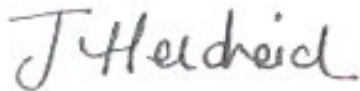
